



Sponsorship of a student at the Nicolas Robinson School with Rainbows4Children

Who needs help?	The Nicolas Robinson School educates the children of some of the most disadvantaged families in the area of Mekele, Tigray, Northern Ethiopia. These children are the sons and daughters of disabled war veterans who are the most financially disadvantaged in society.	
What do I give?	USD 500 per year. 100% of this donation goes to support the student at the school. Rainbows4Children is run by volunteers and so all your money goes to the project in Ethiopia.	
What does this do?	Pays the student's school fees for the year. Assists the family to cover school-related expenses. Covers transport cost to school if needed. Pays for summer school.	
What do I get?	Establish a contact with a student at the school. A letter from the student 3 times a year. An updated photograph of the student once a year. Semester grade reports twice a year.	
Can I choose my student?	You can choose whether you sponsor a boy or a girl and the approximate age or grade. Possibly to match the age of your own children for example. Occasionally we have twins who need sponsorship and this is a lovely opportunity for a family.	
How long must I sponsor?	Most sponsors choose to support their student during all of their school years. Please be prepared to sponsor for at least 6 years and preferably until the student is at university.	
What else can I do?	You can send letters, photos and small gifts through Rainbows4Children and they will be passed on to the student. You will then get feedback.	
Visiting your student	You are welcome to visit your student. You can meet your student at school and even visit them in their homes, as long as the parents agree and visitors are accompanied by a member of staff.
